

among the states that exist or you don't get it that way or you just don't get them or you can turn around and you can build a new Nebraska School of Podiatry, the Nebraska School of Optometry, the Nebraska School of Veterinary Medicine, the Nebraska School of Et Cetera, Et Cetera, Et Cetera. It is going to be more expensive, and I will tell you one thing, Senator Murphy, you talk about not knowing what the cost is going to be. Once you start doing that, I can estimate it for you full well and it would take a lot of wheelbarrows to move it out of here, too. This particular compact is one that I am most proud of because it is controlled, administered, developed by members of the legislature. I should pass around the first compact that they sent around to us proposed by the Governors, by the way. That is where the original proposal came from. The Governors sent us one and they said the Governors will do this and this and this and we rewrote it. I think this has some long range benefits and it is in conjunction with those that are our friends and those we do business with. This compact is going to be more helpful to rural Nebraska than it is anywhere. It is going to be more helpful there because there is where we have the problem in terms of trying to get, first of all, students an educational opportunity, to see that they can get to schools, and then that, secondly, the one that I have heard most often about where we have the lack of skilled personnel particularly as it is health related. I think it is a worthwhile project. I think it has been carefully examined. Every loophole has been put in there that we can put in there. Every closing of those loopholes has been put in there to make sure that we have continued legislative control of it, and the final control, of course, is the appropriation. I ask that the bill be advanced.
