lose a sum of about \$13,000. This doesn't disturb me quite as much as the fact that through the Ravenna area which is generally Senator Cope's, the main line of the Burlington is going through there that comes from Alliance. Through Kearney of course they have the main line of the Union Pacific and over at Minden we have the main line of the south branch of the Burlington Railroad. I for the life of me can't see how the hump at North Platte or the construction at Alliance could operate without the rest of the system. So I think those facilities that are being built there should not be completely credited to those communities for tax purposes and I am not sure how Senator Cullan has worked this out but I certainly support Senator Haberman. I think if they can work out some way that no one loses, why perhaps it might work, and if those communities that think they need more money because of the growth of the railroad, certainly could add some tax to the railroad in those areas. So I think it has some merit. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Nichol, do you wish to be recognized on the Haberman amendment?

SENATOR NICHOL: Yes. Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, if we do this, and I think it is probably a pretty good idea, then we had increased this number, \$376,000, by whatever it takes, Senator Haberman, do you know how much more this would add to that to accomplish this?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Just a moment. Senator Haberman, just a moment. Okay.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Nichol, I do not know how much they would have to increase it.

SENATOR NICHOL: Okay, thank you. It was kind of an unfair question because I am sure you wouldn't have had time to research it this quickly but it would certainly be some. But let's say it makes it another \$100,000 more just for a figure to use, the only thing this does is to increase the cost to the shipper by rail. Now if this is what we want to do and the purpose apparently of the bill is to raise more money for certain areas, and if we want to do this, apparently there is something wrong with the distribution. I haven't comprehended what that is yet but perhaps I will pick it up, but so far, I think I support Senator Haberman's amendment.
