SENATOR KREMER: We're talking about the audit. Well, that's the bill. You have to talk to Senator Warner about that, Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Okay.

SENATOR KREMER: All the amendment does...it has to do with...these motor vehicles that operate in different states, they are apportioned...a certain amount to Nebraska, a certain amount to Iowa, and so on. Now if there is an audit by our Department of Motor Vehicles, and the records are kept over in Iowa, I use this as an example, then the owner has to do that.

SENATOR REUTZEL: I'll ask Senator Warner.

SENATOR KREMER: So he'll answer your question for you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Committee amendments to 227. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We're voting on the Committee amendments to LB 227. Have you all voted? We are working on LB 227. We're voting on the Committee amendments, as explained by Senator Kremer. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay on the adoption of the Committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The Committee amendments are adopted. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I move that LB 227 be advanced to E & R Initial. The effect of the change as it is now proposed with the Committee amendment is twofold. First, it will permit in the case of either trucks that are licensed under prorate, or trucks that are licensed under regular commercial license, which as you recall is thirty some dollars per ton of authorized weight, that in the event that the tractor, which would be generally the case, is down for repair for an extended period of time, and sometimes this could be from two to four or five months perhaps, or longer, that it would be possible to have a refund on that portion of the license for the period of time which the vehicle was down, if it is down for more than a month. It could not be...the way the bill is written, for a period less than twenty-nine days.
