SENATOR WESELY: Okay, thank you very much. I just wanted to raise that point.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the bill as amended. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. I'm sorry...we're advancing the bill, excuse me. The motion is to advance 227 to E & R for Review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote. I'm sorry, did you wish to speak?

CLERK: 25 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: In the north balcony there were 50 eighth grade students, 7 teachers and 3 parents from Christ the King School in Omaha, in Senator Stoney and Goodrich's district. The teacher, the History teacher was Steve Linehan. That was in the north balcony. Senator Kelly, has underneath the south balcony guests, Mary Jo Rasmussen and Leah Horner. Would you please stand so we may recognize you? Are they in the south balcony...there they are. Senator Chambers, are you ready for 524? Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read by title LB 524.) The bill was first read on January 17. It was referred to the Judiciary Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. The body adopted Committee amendments on March 19th of this year. The bill was laid over at that time. I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Are we ready for...were the amendments adopted?

CLERK: Yes sir, they were.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We're ready to advance the bill. Senator Chambers, do you want to make a motion to advance the bill?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, Mr. Chairman, I so move, and the bill was discussed the other day. It was on the consent calendar, and there was not opposition to it. There were questions that Senator Murphy wanted to have answered and we ran out of the fifteen minutes before they were answered. So if any of you do have questions, then I would answer them, but the explanation given that day would hold for today also. So in the interest of time I would simply move that the bill be advanced, and if you have questions prior to the advancement I would be glad to answer them.
