I've heard it stated that putting two eastern votes in Washington D.C. would dilute the farm vote. Your farm vote is diluted because you don't send capable people there to represent you like I would be able to do.

SPEAKER MARVEL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But do you know that the Vice-president of the United States, by Article I of the U.S. Constitution, is made the President of the Senate, and is given the right to vote when they are equally divided, which gives a third vote to whatever state that Vice-president comes from? You don't talk about dilution of vote then because the Vice-president is always white. I know what is being done by this Legislature, and I want you all to help underscore it for everybody in this state, and to make the point that you are representative of your constituency, I'm going to prepare for you a little handout of the scurrilous, racist material that I get, and yet you'll see how well I function on this floor among people who often comport themselves in such fashion that I can refer to them as my enemies.
