PRESIDENT: All right, any further discussion?

SENATOR LEWIS: I move the committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion to adopt the committee amendments on LB 416. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted?

SENATOR LEWIS: What we need to do is to look around a little bit here for a minute.

PRESIDENT: Have you all voted on the committee amendments on LB 416? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the

SENATOR LEWIS: I move the bill be advanced, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Just a moment. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Murphy moves to amend by transferring section 23-2305 to section 84-1503.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Ladies and gentlemen, we've got another happenstance. If you read page one of that bill carefully you will find that we are talking about the duties of the state board having nothing whatever to do with county government and yet we have buried it in county government, chapter twenty-three and it properly belongs in eighty-four. The baiance of the duties of the board are in eighty four and that most specifically speaks to the duties of the state board. Now I am not sure of the mechanics of lifting that section and putting it where it belongs but it certainly would clear up a little bit of it as far as the county government is concerned and it would put all of the duties of the state board in section eighty-four dealing with state government. So the purpose of this amendment is simply to lift that language and if you will read it I think you will agree that it is prescribing the duties of the state board, not of a county board, and let's put it in the part of the book where we can find it. I move the adoption of the amendment.
