PRESIDENT: Speaking to the committee amendments, Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. President, I will make it very brief. We are on consent file. I certainly rise to support Senator Labeledz's efforts. I think the process of providing this commission is going to provide the necessary flow of money, particularly federal money to assist in providing the necessary services in this area. I was tempted, Mr. President, to debate the Theater Arts Building since that is my bill but I will wait until the appropriate time.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, LB 101 was heard just before one of my bills was heard so I had the privilege of being present for part of the public hearing on this proposal. I wish every member of the Legislature could have had that experience. It certainly helped me to understand why LB 101 was so very important this year. I, too, am very appreciative of the efforts of Senator Labeledz in bringing this for our consideration this morning and I want to put my vote in favor of advancing LB 101 and in favor of advancing LB 101A.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Johnson, speaking to the committee amendments now.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, because of the time constraints and the importance of this bill I call the question.

PRESIDENT: All right the question has been called for. Do I see five hands? I do see five hands. Will all those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on ceasing debate? Record the vote.
