personnel, the existing personnel out there on the election boards to deputize these to register the people at this time and also to allow if they get too busy to do it with existing personnel on the election boards to allow them to go to a procedure that would be either similar to or the same as the registration procedure for a person that is outside the county that presently can register by mail. We have a unique situation today that if you have an old person that does not have transportation out in a small town that may be thirty or seventy-five miles from the county seat, they cannot register by mail. However, if a person moves outside the county they can register by mail. Now at best I can't see it complicating things more than the present register by mail provisions and in no way should a cost statement coming out on this be higher than what the benefits are by allowing more people to participate in the electoral process. So I will offer these amendments that will restrict the cost far below what the present impact statements that are provided upon the local subdivisions. The issue will boil down to this. Do we want to use the registration process simply to assure credibility that the person registered is eligible to vote or do we want to use it as one that restricts the number of voters through handicapping them and making it difficult to register? I move the bill be advanced to E & R or to Select File. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I have serious questions about this bill. It seems to me that there is enough confusion on election day without adding the problem of registering voters on that day. As Senator Burrows says those voters are not going to vote that day and I don't believe this is a legitimate function which should be carried on at that time at that place, that there certainly is plenty of time for people to register other than election day at the polling place and I believe this is certainly out of order and I would oppose the bill.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I guess I would be in favor of any way we could get more people to register but I think it is wrong to complicate the election process on election day with registration. I think people
