I'm not really against the hot line and I think that would be good but I'm against setting up new services that we already have partially in place and hope that this will be a realistic program and not another one of these things where we put a lot of money into administration and do very little for those that need the help. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Goodrich. We are addressing the adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I would like very much to have Senator Simon to yield to a couple of questions, please.

SENATOR SIMON: Yes, Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Senator Simon, I noticed in the committee amendments and I'm sorry not to be back in time to get the beginning of your comments but I noticed in the committee amendments you are striking out what the requirements of the law enforcement agency to report by what they shall and shall not do in the way of reporting the child abuse cases. Could you review for me just what your interpretation of what you have done is?

SENATOR SIMON: What we have done with the committee amendments, Senator Goodrich, is to strike out all the objections of the people who came before the committee and testified on it were. We kept in two provisions which we felt were essential to the bill which people said, even the opponents said, were admirable. That is the twenty-four hour hot line and the broadening of the central registry. Anything concerning the police and police powers is left in terms of existing law so we have no way changed that at all.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay. On the committee amendment as it appears in the book, there is one, two, three, three and a half pages. Correct?

SENATOR SIMON: That is correct.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Second page, up at the top there, subsection 2, when a law enforcement agent of any county of 250,000 or more inhabitants shall receive a report concerning the abuse and neglect et cetera. You have stricken it out. Now what I am saying is this. It is essential as far as the national crimes statistics is concerned that
