CLERK: Roll call vote continued. 14 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: A point of inquiry of the Chair. Is the time expired. I have another motion.

PRESIDENT: Yes, the time has expired. In fact it expired a long, long time ago. Motion to raise the Call. Hearing no objection, the Call is raised. We will proceed then, and that will take its place down at the bottom of the consent calendar and we will proceed then with LB 353.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 353. Title read. The bill was read on January 16. It was referred to the Ag and Environment Committee. There are committee amendments by Senator Schmit's Ag and Environment Committee.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, after seeing the vote of the previous bill, I am inclined to kill the bill but then in deference to my good friend, Senator Hoagland, who represents my little sister, I move to adopt the committee amendments.
