SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Reutzel, do you wish to speak on the Wesely amendment?

SENATOR REUTZEL: On the bill. Not on the amendment, on the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question has been called for. You are calling the question in ceasing debate on the amendment that is before the House. All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? We are voting to cease debate. Shall debate cease? I am going to Call once more. We have one minute left on the bill. Shall debate cease? Have you all voted on the motion to cease debate? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely, do you have anything else to say? We have less than a minute left on this bill? Do you want to vote on the Wesely amendment? The bill is not going to advance today anyway. All those in favor of the Wesely amendment...yes, do you want to read the amendment, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Reread Wesely amendment. (See page 1216, Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? I am going to call for the vote. Have you all voted?

SENATOR WESELY: I am going to have to ask for a Call of the House.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You will have to hold the Call of the House for next time because we are out of time.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, that is the end of the debate on this. This bill will go to the bottom of the pile. Okay, Senator Wesely, the Clerk informs me that according to the rules we need to take the Call of the House and take the vote before we can end it. We can't stop in the middle of it.
