SENATOR WESELY: I withdraw that Call and just let the bill go.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 3 nays.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Just a moment. Just a moment. Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Can anyone else call for it or is it too late. I think as long as the vote is like it is we ought to see what we can do with it rather than take it over to Select.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I think the only thing that would have extended the time was the fact that Senator Wesely's motion was pending and when he withdrew his motion that put us back where we were which is the time is up and I don't think anybody could offer an additional motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: That is right. Senator Wesely withdrew his request for a Call of the House. The Clerk will announce the vote.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 3 nays on the adoption of the amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, motion lost. The bill goes to the bottom of the pile. Senator Beutler, do you want to try for LB 198. If we go for more than about three or four minutes, we are going to be in trouble but go ahead. Mr. Clerk, do you want to proceed with LB 198?

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 198. Title read. The bill was read on January 10. It was referred to Public Health and Welfare Committee. Senator Cullan's committee has committee amendments pending. Senator Beutler has amendments to those committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, so you know what Senator Beutler will be amending, I will briefly say that the main purpose of the committee amendments was to include metropolitan class cities in addition to primary cities as having a Director of the Department of Health that not necessarily be a doctor and that we put all of these under one general section of statute and that is
