LB 321, 537, 544

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 321 pass with the emergency clause attached. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1230 of the Legislative Journal.) 34 ayes, 1 nay, 9 excused and not voting and 5 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 321 passes on Final Reading with the emergency clause attached. The Clerk will now read on Final Reading LB 537.

CLERK: (Read LB 537 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 537 pass with the emergency clause attached. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote found on pages 1231-1232 of the Legislative Journal.) 40 ayes, 0 nays, 9 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 537 passes with the emergency clause attached on Final Reading. The Clerk will now read on Final Reading, LB 544.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: Senator Murphy moves to return LB 544 to Select File for a specific amendment to add the word "written" on line 19 before the word "notice".

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: I would apologize for not having followed up on what I believed was concurrent to the Legislature on prior file reading, that if we are to give notice to an individual that he must repair a structure, that for the protection of the individual and any subsequent action, that that notice should be in writing. I believe the body agreed to it but apparently I did not follow up on it and see that it was done. For that I apologize and I ask that the bill be brought back and the word "written" inserted ahead of the word "notice" unless Senator Keyes as chairman of the committee would have some objection.
