PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy, is there any close on your motion? The motion then is to return LR 5 to Select File for purposes of a specific amendment to add the words to place it on the primary ballot which will require the 40 votes at that point. All those in favor of returning LR 5 vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries and LR 5 is returned for specific amendment. Senator Murphy, we will just take it up right now. We are at the end of Final Reading so technically we are off of Final Reading but we will just it up right now on Select File, if you would care to make the motion.

SENATOR MURPHY: I would move the bill be readvanced.

PRESIDENT: We have go to adopt the amendment first.

SENATOR MURPHY: I am sorry, to adopt the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on the motion by Senator Murphy to adopt the amendment on LR 5? Any discussion? If not, all those in favor of adopting the amendment on Select File vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the amendment, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The amendment is adopted. What do you wish to do with the bill, Senator Murphy?

SENATOR MURPHY: I now move that the bill be readvanced to E & R engrossing.

PRESIDENT: All right, LR 5 is... motion to advance to E & R for engrossment. All those in favor signify by
