will undertake to make it a state responsibility to notify every individual who may be effected by that bill, that it is moved from the status of a bill to that of a law, however, if there is some way for the Health Department to notify these people who run restaurants and who are licensed through the Health Department, perhaps that would be something worthy of consideration, Senator Simon, so I'm not expressing opposition to what you have said. I am just not sure right now.

SENATOR NICHOL: The question has been called. I guess we are out of names anyway so, Senator Maresh, would you like to close please?

SENATOR MARESH: Yes, Senator Nichol. Mr. Chairman, this would exclude the small restaurants that would be affected by this law if it passes and this would include an area of sixty by thirty feet which is a small area and these restaurants would have a hard time to segregate the smokers and nonsmokers in the small eating places so I move that this amendment be adopted.
