SENATOR DeCAMP: I understand.

SENATOR STONEY: And there is no prohibition if a smoker is with a group of five individuals that are nonsmokers that he or she go into that nonsmoking area and refrain from smoking. There is nothing wrong with that.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I guess my problem there and I'm just talking about a specific instance but heck, I know I am going to have to face up to it if the bill passes. In any group that comes in, I swear there is going to be at least one out of two of them smoking, so if I designate half of it nonsmoking or whatever, I just don't see that it is going to be workable.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You have one minute.

SENATOR DeCAMP: And trying to enforce it, I would hate to tangle with that six foot four inch cowboy because they is tough.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Chambers, then Senator Venditte and then I will go to Senator Stoney.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I will be brief, Mr. Chairman. Senator DeCamp, do you remember when I went out in your part of the territory there were very few people, you call them cowboys, who were smaller than I am but I told you I am willing to go anyplace you take me. Didn't I?

SENATOR DeCAMP: But you made me bring you back that night.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But, Senator DeCamp, don't you feel it is the size of the fight in the man rather than the size of the man in the fight and aren't you, in fact, physically afraid of having this bill in effect?

SENATOR DeCAMP: I am physically afraid of tackling five, six foot four inch cowboys in my place, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator DeCamp, does your place conform to the requirements that there be a restroom facility for females and one for males?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes, it does. Two of them, in fact, Ernie.
