own wife was put out with him for that little act, which I described as treacherous. When Senator Labeledz mentions Jack Cavanaugh being returned to the County Board over and over, that was not an act of South Omaha, and Cavanaugh did not represent South Omaha, unless putting that waste treatment plant was what he does it for and thinks of South Omaha and the clogging of 24th Street. That's the kind of representation South Omaha has had. They built little barriers and obstacles in the commercial district on 24th Street supposedly to make the cars have to stop so they'd go in the stores, but it was so vecacious, so burdensome and so obnoxious that people simply avoided the commercial district of South Omaha altogether, and those wise people had to go down there and tear all of these obstacles and barricades out of 24th Street. That is some of the inanity, i-n-a-n-i-t-y, which occurs, not insanity, which occurs in Omaha, because of the kind of people who are elected. Senator Kelly, your amendment, I think, is a frivolous one because of the circumstances under which it is offered, and I think it ought to be defeated.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Simon.

SENATOR SIMON: Are there any more lights, Mr. Speaker?

SPEAKER MARVEL: No, this is the last light. The question is on the second Kelly amendment. All those in favor of the Kelly amendment vote aye, opposed vote no. We're voting on the Kelly amendment to LB 345. Have you all voted on the amendment? Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 19 nays on the motion to adopt, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion lost. Senator Wesely, do you want to move the bill?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, Mr. Speaker. I move the advancement of LB 344 (sic).

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of advancing 345 say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The bill is advanced. 418.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are E & R amendments, however...

SENATOR WESELY: Do you want to move them?
