SPEAKER MARVEL: Now Senator Lamb in answering the question you are closing.

SENATOR LAMB: I think I understand your question, Senator Newell, and I would only repeat that there may be hundreds of these devices in operation in future years, and that those which are to be used for a legitimate business purpose it seems there is no reason to get permission through the Public Service Commission in order to use them. Now those that are going to be used for advertising...okay, we're saying that those need to be regulated, that we need to have the Public Service Commission involved and this bill with the amendment which I have proposed will allow that.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is on the Lamb amendment to LB 257. All those in favor vote aye. Opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The motion that you are voting on is the Lamb amendment to LB 257. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is passed and the amendment is adopted. Now Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I move for the advancement of LB 257 to E & R for Engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye. Opposed no. The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. The next one is 278. Do you have some amendments to that one?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes. I move the E & R amendments to LB 278.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye. Opposed no. The motion is carried. The E & R amendments are adopted.
