SENATOR MARESH: Well, that's more down your line, Senator Reutzel. If you want to try to amend it...

SENATOR REUTZEL: I was just curious. We'll let it go this time.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Did you answer the question, Senator Maresh?

SENATOR MARESH: Yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is the adoption of amendment number (1) as designated in lines 2 and 3 of the Maresh amendments to LB 227. All those in favor of that amendment vote aye, opposed no. Voting on Maresh amendment number (1) to 227. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the first Maresh amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The first amendment is adopted. The second amendment in the same area starting with lines 4 and paragraphs 2 and 3, and on the next page paragraphs 4, 5 and 6 are all part of amendment number (2).

SENATOR MARESH: Yes, Mr. Speaker, what this does, it does the same thing as we did on the license fee. This would allow a credit or a refund on the taxes paid on this vehicle. This could amount to quite a bit of money and this is also an oversight in the law that wasn't caught up to now. I move that this amendment be adopted.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to...the motion is the adoption of the Maresh amendment number (2) to 227. All those in favor....Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Well, Mr. Speaker, I'd like to ask Senator Maresh what we are amending, and what we are doing to these amendments, and who this is going to affect?

SENATOR MARESH: Senator Keyes, this would affect the owners of cabin trailers, you know, a cabin trailer is like a camper only it's on wheels...

SENATOR KEYES: Yes.
