SENATOR REUTZEL: Okay, I think that answered my question, Senator Warner, and I would just say that I noticed that Senator Warner didn't vote for LB 10 which was vetoed and now he's carrying essentially the same bill in 227, and I feel kind of lonely, Senator Warner, day in and day out being the only person with a bill vetoed, and therefore I'm going to vote for 227, because I feel that the Governor I'm sure wants to be consistent and keep the faith of his veto message on LB 10 that this would be a monstrosity and I'm going to wish it Godspeed and good luck and vote for this bill so that we can increase our numbers to two in this small, little club.
