CLERK: There are E & R amendments, Mr. President to LB 524.

SENATOR WESELY: I move the E & R amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of the motion on 524 say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers now moves to amend. His amendments are on Page 1201 of the Journal. (Read Chambers' amendments to LB 524.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Members of the Legislature, this bill relates to the possibility of a fine being levied on an individual who refuses to testify or produce evidence when such is required by the Grand Jury. There was an inadvertent omission of the amount of the fine, and it was caught by, I started to say Senator Emery, but by Emery Burnett, and called to my attention and it is not something which could be corrected by an E & R amendment. So that's what this amendment is for, to put that figure in so that it is a part of the bill. I ask that you adopt it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to adopt the Chambers' amendment to 524. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. The amendment to 524. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the amendment adopted. Senator Chambers, are you ready to advance the bill? Senator Wesely. Sorry.

SENATOR WESELY: I move that LB 524 be advanced to E & R for Engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye.
