SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Fowler, you have three amendments, you are proposing adoption of the first one? Okay, the motion is the adoption of amendment number (1) of Senator Fowler's. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. We're voting on Fowler amendment number (1) as explained. Have you all voted? It's the Fowler amendment number (1). Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Fowler. I'm going to call once more for the vote, and then record. We're voting on Fowler amendment number (1) to LB 52. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion lost.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Fowler now has an amendment on Page 1156, but I think he...

SENATOR FOWLER: Yes, I want to withdraw the second.

CLERK: Alright.

SENATOR FOWLER: Are there any objections? So ordered. The third amendmen?

CLERK: Yes sir, I do. Senator Fowler moves to amend in the Committee amendments...(Read third Fowler amendment as found on Page 1283 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR FOWLER: This amendment is not in the Journal, but I had it handed out on your desk today, and this is what the Bar Association said it would accept as far as regulation of the financing of the insurance company, that they would not use the dues money to capitalize it. I think this is the very least we could do as far as limiting that, as far as unfair competition. It does not...my second amendment indicated that they could not use the dues money for advertising, or set up costs, or administration directly or indirectly, but they didn't want that amendment because they intend to take these mandatory dues taken from all the attorneys, including the attorneys in this Legislature, to set up their corporation. But I would at least move this amendment, and it's acceptable I believe with the Bar Association, and Senator DeCamp said that I'm to ask him if it's acceptable with him. Senator DeCamp, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes, it's fine.

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
