They couldn't even have this program without the Legislature enacting a bill, then after you create this opportunity for them to extort money from people, they're going to tell you you have no right to regulate it. Do you buy that? That's how lawyers can live, because they can beguile, trick and fool you. Without the Legislature's action there cannot be this program, or else they wouldn't have brought the bill, but once you put the program into operation the court says you have nothing to say about it and you buy it. I have contempt for the Bar Association, and I've expressed it on many occasions. And I have contempt for the attitude of judges which will encourage a spirit of cowardice and subservience in those who come to practice before that bench. Do you know I've seen judges tell lawyers without a coat and a necktie you can't practice in this courtroom? Now I've been in courtrooms dressed like I am now, and they know that if they say something to me, I'm going to say something back, and I know he's a little God...a little tin plate artificial God who can tell me, take him...tell the sheriff, take him to jail for two days because he opened his mouth, had the audacity to assert some manhood in my courtroom when I wanted to play Superman, so I go to jail. I haven't had that happen yet, but I'm sure it's in the cards for me. But it will show something to the public and it will show how the courts and the judges ought to be dealt with on issues of substance. I think that the amendment which Senator Fowler offered at first should have been adopted, but the Legislature chose not to because Larry Ruth said that the judges said, and the Bar Association said, you better not do it. Then he had another meritorious one, which said that dues could not be used for advertising, promotion and all the other things that you do with reference to a commercial venture, and you got word that the Bar Association will not accept that. Well, it may not work, but I have a message that I want to give to the Bar Association, and it's in the form of a motion to indefinitely...

SPEAKER MARVEL: You've got one minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...postpone, and when another item comes before us and the judges have told us we have no right to meddle in anything, let them go on eating at the level they've been eating, because if they've persuaded the Legislature so well that the division of powers requires that we not regulate this type of insurance program, I don't think we ought to be messing with the salaries either.
