CLERK: Yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Before we move to #10 in Motions, tomorrow we will start with Final Reading for thirty minutes and then we will move to Special Order 285, which is the lid bill, and set aside an hour and fifteen minutes for consideration. There will be some amendments that will be distributed from Senator Keyes. Now with those....and in the Journal, tomorrow's Journal there will be a list of the Special Order bills for the next two weeks. Mr. Clerk, are you ready for LR 35?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I am. LR 35 introduced by Senator Stoney, Schmit, Simon, Fitzgerald, Venditte and Goodrich...(Read LR 35.) Mr. President, that will be...that can be found on Page 1084 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: There are six introducers. Who wishes to be recognized? Senator Goodrich, do you wish to be recognized on LR 35? Senator Stoney? Do you wish to be recognized? We need an adoption of the amendment....or the motion.

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. Speaker, I'd move for the adoption of the resolution. It's self-explanatory. As you well know, I think that it would be beneficial if the members of this body would by adoption of this resolution indicate their support, their endorsement and encouragement that these contests in the future continue. I think it's good from the standpoint of competitive rivalry, and I'd move for the adoption of the resolution.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of LR 35. Is there any further discussion? All those in favor of that motion vote aye. Opposed vote no. Okay, the motion is carried...Clerk record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The resolution's adopted. LR 36.
