PRESIDENT: LB 249 passes on Final Reading. The Clerk will now read on Final Reading, LB 315.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 315 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 315 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote found on page 1298 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 43 ayes, 1 nay, 3 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting.
