we wouldn't have a limitation and that would be up to the city council in North Platte. It would be up to the school board in Anselmo-Merna. It would be up to Jefferson County. It would be up to those people that are best able to control what their expenditures are and know it. However, if we are not going to do that because we have some interesting financial patterns too. I would suggest we not get too pious in terms of our intention to provide guidance to those local officials who obviously don't know anything. Senator Dworak has brought forth a proposal that provides for no increase in growth unless it is 7%. Very few counties next year are going to grow by 7%. Very few cities will grow by 7%. Very few school districts will grow by 7% but the growth they have, if they add fifteen people to Lincoln, Nebraska, that is going to create a demand for more money. If you add twenty five people to the Bellwood schools that is going to create a demand for more money. If you add fifteen people to the City of Neligh that is going to demand an increase of more money. I support the committee amendments and oppose the Dworak amendments.

When we get home we are going to be asked a lot of questions and it would be very helpful if we could have the script that you used.
