CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp's motion reads as follows: To repeal all provisions of LB 1, First Special Session, 1978.

PRESIDENT: Okay. All right, that should answer the question that Senator Chambers made relative to what it does. Senator Dworak, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, that explanation is contrary to what Senator DeCamp said. If I might ask a question, he indicated that in addition to eliminating all provisions to LB 1, he also indicated it eliminated LB 285.

PRESIDENT: Without being argumentative, the motion was read and answers the question itself. I think... Senator Chambers raised the issue. The Clerk read it and without getting into any more debate, you can all vote on it. You heard the motion. You can make that decision voting aye or nay. That is going to be the ruling of the Chair on this. Are you ready to have a roll call vote? Is anybody ready for a roll call? We have got about two more people to get in here. Senator Kremer is not here. Are you ready to go, Senator DeCamp? Senator DeCamp. All right we are ready for a roll call. Proceed with the roll call, Mr. Clerk.
