SENATOR GOODRICH: I so move.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor say aye, opposed no.
Motion carried.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Now, Mr. President, Senator Simon would like to try his other amendment, the other portion of this, the one I actually referred to and I have no objection to that. It really should go along with this anyhow. He would like to now move to bring it back but he will have to get the written form of it up to the desk.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you have the amendment, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I have.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is to return LB 505 to Select File for the specific amendment. Senator Simon, do you want to explain the amendment?

SENATOR SIMON: Just very briefly. When Senator Goodrich offered his amendments, he inadvertently struck out part of a section which was necessary and that is that would require the reporting to the central registry by the law enforcement agencies of any reports of abuse or neglect whether or not they actually went out and found a person guilty and did something so I need to put this on. I move to return LB 505 to Select File for this specific amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is to return LB 505 to Select File for the specific amendment as explained by Senator Simon. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? This is the return of the bill for the specific amendment. Have you all voted? We are voting on the return of LB 505 to Select File. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the return.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the bill is returned to Select File. Now, Senator Simon, do you want to move the adoption of the amendment?

SENATOR SIMON: I move for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of adopting the amendment as explained by Senator Simon vote aye, opposed no. Senator Venditte.
