So in closing I am going to say what Winston Churchill said and to tailgate on what Senator Kahle said. By the way it is somewhat uncomfortable or unusual to be in company with Senator Kahle on several issues in one week and also I would like to welcome Senator Venditte to the un-American anti law enforcement camp today, and now I would like to quote Winston Churchill. This bill is not the end. It may not even be the beginning of the end but it can be the end of the beginning.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. Speaker, I would respectfully call for the question.

SENATOR MURPHY: I will not dwell on the point at all. I move the adoption of my motion to bring 221 to the floor.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Murphy moves to place LB 221 on General File pursuant to rule 3, section 10.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. It needs 25 votes. Have you all voted? Clerk, record.
