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SENATOR DUIS: I mean with the university here, not Southern Methodist or some place. I am talking about the University of Nebraska.

SENATOR LEWIS: I think one of the biggest pleasures I had was cochairing the Postsecondary Committee with Senator Warner when we recommended and finally succeeded in the first time in the history of the state in saying what institutions would do and I think that is exactly what we need to do with the university.

SENATOR DUIS: Who are they doing this with now?

SENATOR LEWIS: Our primary carrier for vet medicine as an example would probably be Iowa State and we have a few slots in other places but Iowa State is our prime. The university from time to time doesn't like this kind of philosophy. Neither do the Tech Colleges and Metro of Omaha I can tell you because we cut out some of their programs and I think some of you that served on the committee with us will understand that. The whole gist of this and again, I don't want to take up much of your time.

SENATOR DUIS: You are entirely welcome to it.

SENATOR LEWIS: This is a vehicle. This is a vehicle to return those kind of cooperations where it belongs, Legislature to Legislature, Governor to Governor, and tell the university we expect so many slots. We expect help for those students.

SENATOR DUIS: Now, may I interrupt? You might tell the university. Will they have to do it?

SPEAKER MARVEL: You have one minute.

SENATOR LEWIS: Well again I don't want to refer to any of my relatives but my mother understands that finances usually brings the university in line in the quickest step that I know of.

SENATOR DUIS: Well let's don't... I am trying to approach this seriously. I really am.

SENATOR LEWIS: So am I. So am I.

SENATOR DUIS: And I am going to go along with your legislation but what I am trying to get through, are we past the stages of just plain organization?
