The bill was the efforts of Senator Kahle and myself and several others and we have had this in the Education Committee for two years and we are trying to define cooperative purchasing for service units, who they can purchase for, who they can't purchase for and the kinds of materials they can purchase and I think this is a bill that is needed for educational service units to give them a definitive, a direction on cooperative purchasing either among the ESUs for their membership schools or by ESU by itself. So I ask for you to provide me with 30 votes for the privilege of reconsidering our action on LB 57. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is the reconsideration of the vote on final passage on LB 57. All those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the first motion under item #5 which has to do with reconsideration of a vote on final passage. Have you all voted?
