SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator George, then Senator Lamb.

SENATOR GEORGE: Thank you, Mr. President, A question of Senator Maresh if he would yield.

SENATOR MARESH: Yes, Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Your amendment now is 1200?

SENATOR MARESH: 1200 square feet which would be about a 30 by 40, approximately 30 by 40 square feet.

SENATOR GEORGE: Or something like 20 by 60 feet?

SENATOR MARESH: Yes.

SENATOR GEORGE: Do you consider that really a small restaurant in a small town, 20 by 60 feet?

SENATOR MARESH: It would be a pretty small restaurant, yes.

SENATOR GEORGE: Well, I guess that is a relative kind of thing what you consider small.

SENATOR MARESH: See, if they serve liquor there they are exempt, automatically exempt, if they do not serve over 100 people or what is it, something like that.

SENATOR GEORGE: They are exempt of what?

SENATOR MARESH: I say in the bill now a small restaurant that has a serving bar and serve liquor they are automatically exempt but if they serve just food then they have to comply so this would exempt the small places, the very small places.

SENATOR GEORGE: Okay, thank you. Could I ask Senator Stoney a question.

SENATOR STONEY: Yes, Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Without further going into it....

SPEAKER MARVEL: Could we have a little more attention please.

SENATOR GEORGE: ...maybe you would like to amend this amendment to something like maybe, I don't want to make this an auction here, but a 20 by 60 restaurant is not really a small restaurant in terms of small restaurants in towns we were originally talking about, those that may have about
