SENATOR KOCH: I will allow Senator Keyes to speak first.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Keyes. Excuse me, Senator Keyes, you are not next. Senator DeCamp is next.

SENATOR KEYES: Don't call for the question.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator DeCamp. Senator DeCamp, do you yield your time to Senator Keyes? Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, I will take about two minutes. Senator Kelly, will you answer a question from me that I ask you?

SENATOR KELLY: Yes.

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Kelly, when I came through the lobby back there, I got some opposition telling to send this back to committee for a restudy again and I am going to read you one little part of this bill and you tell me if that is what you think the opposition from the back beyond the double doors is about.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator DeCamp, did you want to finish.....

SENATOR KEYES: "And in which the plumbing, heating, and electrical systems contained therein may be operated without connection to outside utilities." Is it true that we have some people in Nebraska that want to bring these trailers and these homes in without the plumbing and without the electrical and without these things in and do it in Nebraska?

SENATOR KELLY: I am not aware of that but that maybe is true. I don't know.

SENATOR KEYES: That is the only thing I can see wrong with this bill and this would mean that if we take this section out of the bill and demand that they come in without any plumbing, without any heating, without any electrical work in them, that the laborers and the people in this state will be able to do that. If that is the opposition, that's all that is going to do is add prior cost to the price and it is going to split me and my best of laboring friends but I do not support bringing homes manufactured that will meet the standards of Nebraska, and if that is laboring people, no matter where they are at, whether they are in Michigan where there are a lot of these made, I would oppose sending this back for a committee on those grounds. Senator DeCamp, you may finish up.
