Department of Health to set up that program. These amendments set out some requirements with respect to continuing education and requirements for entry into the field and are necessary so that those guidelines are available. I should tell you that some of the paramedics in Omaha would like much more stringent guidelines. It is my opinion that these guidelines are stringent enough. They are, in fact, stronger than the requirements, reentry requirements for nurses and I think that that is sufficient. So with those comments I would move for the adoption of these amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 298. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. We are voting on the committee amendments to 298 on Select File. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The amendment is adopted. Senator Wesely, are we ready to advance the bill?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes. I move that LB 298 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor say aye, opposed no. Motion carried, bill is advanced. Senator George has some amendments to LB 250. If there is no objection we will pass over that and go to LB 412.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, I move the E & R amendments to LB 412.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion carried.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Duis now moves to amend LB 412 and those amendments are on page 1145 of the Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Duis.
