CLERK: 29 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, debate shall cease. We now are voting on the last Labeledz amendment. All those in favor of that amendment vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Labeledz's amendment.
