Senator Venditte, that is a small amount for this Legislature to spend to be able to pick up a little bit of public consideration as a not totally heartless mob, sitting down here in the Legislature, but for my part I want the record to show that I am for this commission even if it means spending more money than exists in that fiscal note now because even where law enforcement people are concerned, Senator Venditte, they don't want the wage that they get this year to be frozen there, they want a certain amount every year. There are other people who are getting amounts of money that they really don't need but here we are talking about providing services for people who merit them as much as anybody in the society and I hope that the remainder of the discussion will not center around fiscal conservatism. If we have a sledge hammer in the Legislature let's use it against a dinosaur or a tyrannosaur but not the gnats, the mosquitoes and the ants, Senator Venditte.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, members of the body, I would like to ask Senator Labeledz a couple of questions.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes, Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Senator Labeledz, I have a concern and the concern is simply this. I think that one of my fears about this kind of a commission and one of my fears about this kind of a proposal is that it is the first of many other commissions that are going to be similar in nature. Now I want to ask you a question. It is a hypothetical question at this point. I may offer amendments. Let me preface this for a second also. I personally favor a commission. I favor a commission that will look and act and respond to the needs of various people who have problems and who need some special attention and I think the deaf are one of those groups but my concern is this, that maybe what we ought to do in order to avoid duplication,
