SPEAKER MARVEL: 416?

SENATOR MURPHY: Yes, sir. We have several amendments there that should be acted upon and I think Senator Schmit has an amendment that will take care of the amendment Senator Lewis would have offered. In fact, it supercedes it if I am not mistaken and it is with the agreement of Senator Lewis.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Hasebroock, do you have any comments on that? Is this a retirement bill?

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, yes, I think if they move that amendment that I think they are going to have, I haven't seen it. I think I would like to have a chance to look at that a little bit to see what that will do to the bill actuarially before we move it ahead. I would like to...if it changes it too much we may have to send it back to committee for further actuarial study.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Murphy, do you object to laying the bill over until we get a hold of Senator Lewis?

SENATOR MURPHY: I guess not.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, as per a request from Senator Hasebroock. LB 251. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I move the E & R amendments to LB 251.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The amendment is adopted. Senator George wanted 251 laid over until he got some amendments. We got the E & R amendments adopted?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. We will go then to 207.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, I move the E & R amendments to LB 207.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion carried.
