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and my mother always used to say that on my first birthday America declared war on Germany, so...

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Okay. Well, Happy Birthday, Senator Kahle from all of us.

SENATOR KAHLE: Thank you.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Alright, we'll proceed then with Agenda Item #5. The introduction of bills, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Warner moves for the introduction Request #899 by the Appropriations Committee.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, these are four bills, two of which are appropriation bills. LB 899 is not an appropriation bill. What it does is authorize...changes existing law so whenever the State Department of Aeronautics replaces an aircraft, under existing law if they...they could trade the aircraft in on a replacement, but if they were to purchase a replacement and then perhaps could make a better business deal by outright selling the aircraft, the receipts for that would go to the general fund. What the bill proposes is to handle aircraft identically as we do motor vehicles, which as they are disposed of by the state, the...as you know at auctions that money is returned to the fund for the purchasing of... the replacement of those automobiles, and this is to handle aircraft in the same and like manner. I might point out, while it's not in this bill, in the appropriations bill we do have language which establishes a charge covering that the state aircraft would be charging back to the agencies. It covers overhead, maintenance operation, and is intended to build up funds to acquire the replacement of aircraft in orderly manner just as we do motor vehicles currently. I move the introduction of this bill.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Any further discussion on Senator Warner's motion? Senator Warner, I trust I didn't hear you say LB 899...that was request 899.

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, request 899, yes, thank you.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Thank you. It kind of scared me for a minute there. Any further discussion? If not, Senator Warner, that will be your close I presume. So the question is, shall request #899 be introduced? All those in favor
