CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the introduction of the bill. Mr. President, a new bill, LB 590. (Read by title for the first time LB 590 as found on Page 1343 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, Senator Warner moves for the introduction of request #912 by the Appropriations Committee.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner on request #912.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, request 912 is an appropriation bill. It has approximately two and a half million in it. This is the bill that we refer to as a supplemental priority bill, which will not be considered as a part of the main line appropriation bills, but it is recommendations for appropriations for about seven or eight different purposes that we felt the Legislature should consider.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Any further discussion then on the request #912? All those in favor then of introduction of request #912 vote aye, opposed nay. It requires thirty votes. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Request #912 of the Appropriations Committee. It requires thirty votes. Record the vote.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 1 nay on the introduction of the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The bill is introduced. Read the bill.
