This repeals all of those provisions. It has an effective date of July 1, 1980, but again the purpose of the bill is to formally put the issue before the Committee to be working with during the interim.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Any discussion on request #909? If not, all those in favor of introducing request #909 vote aye, opposed nay. It requires thirty votes. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the introduction of the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The motion carries. The request is introduced. Read the bill, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 592. (Read by title for the first time LB 592 as found on Page 1344 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The next request #913, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Warner moves for the introduction of request #913 by the Appropriations Committee.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, request 913 is the reappropriation and the reaffirmation of capital construction currently in progress, or currently authorized by previous appropriation bills of previous sessions. I move its adoption.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Any discussion on request #913? The question then is the introduction of request #913 for a bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. It requires thirty votes. Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to introduce, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The motion carries. The bill is introduced. Read the bill, Mr. Clerk.
