SENATOR MARSH: Yes, Senator...

SENATOR GEORGE: You said that they wanted this removed. They wanted reference to it...what is it...I'm not sure what we are...

SENATOR MARSH: Yes, excuse me, it's the Orthopedic Hospital section, Senator George, which is no longer in existence as such, and they felt this was the best way to clear that language, was to remove those paragraphs from the law completely.

SENATOR GEORGE: Thank you. That clarifies it.

PRESIDENT LEUDTKE: Any...Senator Landis. Alright, the question...Senator Marsh, do you wish to close on your motion? The motion to amend the...Senator Reutzel. Alright, the question then is the adoption of the amendment to the Committee amendments offered by Senator Marsh. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.
