Call? Senator Reutzel so moves. Any objections? So ordered. The Call is raised. That will take care of the special order. We got finished within one minute of the time allotted by the Speaker. CLERK: Mr. President, LB 179 was introduced by Senator David Landis of the 46th. (Read LB 179 by title.) The bill was read on January 10th of this year. It was referred to the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are Committee amendments by Senator Keyes' Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Before I recognize Senator Keyes, the Chair would like to introduce from Senator Hasebrook's district sixteen pupils from District 32 School, Howells, Nebraska. There are also eight adults with this group. They're in the south balcony. Would they stand up and be recognized from Howells? Welcome to your Legislature. The Chair recognizes Senator Keyes for the Committee amendments.

SENATOR KEYES: I move for the adoption of the Committee amendments. All they do is change it from "shall" to "may", and what's the other thing? And add the "Clerk of the District Court" to it. So I move for the adoption of these amendments.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Alright, is there any discussion on the Committee amendments? Senator Newell, did you wish to speak to the Committee amendments? Alright, there is... no one else wants to speak, so we're ready again. Senator Keyes, that is your opening and your closing. All those in
