SPEAKER MARVEL: What do we need to do then with 416?

SENATOR MURPHY: I have three corrective amendments, Mr. Chairman.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Hasebroock. Okay. Senator Koch, your light's on.

SENATOR KOCH: Well, not necessarily on this bill, Mr. Speaker, but 418A, there's no need to pass over that, because that bill was sent back to that Committee and it's going to live there for quite a while.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well, okay.

SENATOR KOCH: The other bill we don't need at all.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You mean you want to indefinitely postpone 418A?

SENATOR KOCH: I'll put a motion up there to that effect.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Would you? Okay, we'll wait...we'll await Senator Koch's amendment...is he going to write it? Okay. 418, we'll have a motion to indefinitely postpone, which lays it over until the first of the week. Senator Murphy, we'll now go to 416.
