SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all recorded your presence?

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you have anything to read into the

CLERK: One thing, Mr. President. Your Committee on
Appropriations would like to have an Executive Session
Monday, April 9 at noon in Room 1003. Signed, Senator

SPEAKER MARVEL: In the south balcony from Senator
Burrows' district forty-one 4th grade students from
Lincoln School in Beatrice. Mrs. Mulvaney and Mrs. Hoppe,
teachers. Will you raise your hands so we can see where
you are, and say hello to you? We're going to start off
with the Consent Calendar this afternoon marked April 2nd,
1979. Okay, the first thing you do is go to your green
agenda sheet first and we'll take up six bills on the
March 26, 1979 Consent Calendar and then go to the April
2nd Consent Calendar. The first bill is LB 387.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 387 was introduced by Senator
Cal Carsten of the 2nd District. (Read title to LB 387.)
The bill was read on January 17th. It was referred to
the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee.
The bill was advanced to General File. There are pending
Committee amendments by Senator Keyes' Government Committee,
Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Carsten, can you take the
Committee amendments?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Yes, Mr. President, I think I can. The
Committee amendments...first of all, in request from the
Secretary of State in order to make uniformity dealing
with registered voters, we clarified that to conform to
