SENATOR GOODRICH: Not by...

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay, I've got 348 out. What part of it?

SENATOR NEWELL: Well, if you'll look at the Committee amendments, it is under the Committee amendments on Page 2, line 1 and 5. What we have done is strike "private" and inserted "restricted". Would this not also be considered under your amendment? Wouldn't restricted also be anyone that meets the rest of the qualifications?

SENATOR GOODRICH: No, because the bill deals with parking lots that are operated as parking lots, and I'm just adding and piggybacking, frankly, onto this bill to cover private lots not operated as parking lots.

SENATOR NEWELL: Thank you, Senator.

SENATOR GOODRICH: And bill drafting said this is the way to do it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We're ready for the adoption of the Goodrich amendment. All those in favor of the Goodrich amendment to 348 vote aye, opposed no. The motion before the House is the Goodrich amendment to LB 348. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? We're voting on the Goodrich amendment to LB 348. Have you all voted? Senator Goodrich.
