SPEAKER MARVEL: A Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor of placing the House under Call vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please return to their seats. Record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. We are under Call on the Goodrich amendment to LB 348. Okay. All legislators are in their seats. We will accept call-in votes.

CLERK: Senator Wesely voting aye. Senator Schmit voting aye. Senator Warner voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all...

CLERK: Senator Brennan voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carried. The amendment's adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Duis now moves to amend the bill. (Read Duis amendment as found on Page 1354 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is that the way it's worded? Senator Duis.
