File for the specific amendments as referred to by Senator Keyes. All those in favor of returning the bill vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the bill is returned. Now, Senator Keyes, do you have any....Senator Keyes, do you have any additional remarks?

SENATOR KEYES: No, thank you. I would move we adopt the amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, members of the body, these, if I could ask Senator Keyes a question or three.

SENATOR KEYES: I will answer one and three and skip two then.

SENATOR NEWELL: Okay. Senator Keyes, how long have these amendments been on my desk?

SENATOR KEYES: They have been in the Journal for...several days ago I had them printed. They were at the hearing in the committee probably three or four weeks ago. We had a hearing. I decided we did not want to or couldn't bring the whole bill forward so I said we will bring the amendments forward that Allen Beermann says that he has to have because of court cases and federal law and that is the only ones that are here.

SENATOR NEWELL: The question I would ask, since you didn't bring the entire bill forward....

SENATOR KEYES: No, I didn't bring the entire bill forward.

SENATOR NEWELL: Which I think would be a better place to discuss this, this is going to move through now sort of in a...just attach it on and I think...is it too much to ask that you explain at least one or two of these things so that I could understand them?

SENATOR KEYES: Ask me about them, and if I understand them, I will explain them to you. I am not much of a court man. I am not a lawyer nor am I a judge nor do I write the federal law.
