SPEAKER MARVEL: Three excused.

SENATOR SIMON: I will ask for a Call of the House.

SPEAKER MARVEL: A Call of the House has been requested. Clear the Board. All legislators...I am sorry. All in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 10 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner, Senator George, Senator Cope, Senator Keyes, Senator Wesely, Senator Schmit, Senator Rumery, Senator Merz, Senator Brennan, Senator Wagner, Senator Haberman, Senator Newell, Senator Frank Lewis, Senator Chambers, Senator Duis, Senator Labeledz. Senator Chambers and Senator Brennan, and Labeledz in addition to the three who are absent. Do you wish to proceed? We are absent one, we are absent two actually. We sent a page after Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR SIMON: I don't want to delay the process. Senator Chambers, is he to be found? If we could wait for maybe sixty seconds and then I will be ready to go ahead and start. Mr. President, I understand that Senator Chambers is out of the building so the only person that is unaccounted for is Senator Labeledz. I think we can go ahead and start the roll call. I don't want to delay the body anymore. I would ask for a roll call.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Call the roll.

CLERK: Roll call voted taken. (See pages 1368 and 1369, Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. The Call is raised. Senator Haberman, for what, your light is on. Okay, the Call is raised. Senator Keyes, do you have a motion in regard to LB 187?

SENATOR KEYES: This is a very short simple motion. I move we indefinitely postpone....

SPEAKER MARVEL: 187.

SENATOR KEYES: 187. This bill has been before the committee, the Revenue Committee, a couple of years. We have amended it. It is in good shape, and if you wish to hear the bill, have it read, vote no. If you wish to not hear it read, vote yes.
