SENATOR KEYES: Okay, thank you. Then let's just go ahead and read it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Before the Clerk begins to read LB 187 on Final Reading from Senator DeCamp's area, I wish to introduce in the South balcony 6 ninth and twelfth graders from the O'Neill Public Schools, O'Neill, Nebraska, one teacher and one parent, Dorothy Lambert is the teacher. Where are you located so we can say good morning? Now Final Reading. Clerk will read, LB 187.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 187. (Recorder turned off for Final Reading.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: There is about three more minutes of reading so we try to alert the members that about three minutes from now we will be ready to vote on this particular bill. Sergeant at Arms, if you see anybody out in the hall, you might alert them.

CLERK: Continued Final Reading on LB 187.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Senator Keyes, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR KEYES: Do I understand that this bill has the emergency clause?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR KEYES: And that means it takes how many votes?

SPEAKER MARVEL: 33 votes.

SENATOR KEYES: 33 votes and I presume that we should just quit.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: Record vote read. (See pages 1378 and 1379, Legislative Journal.) 36 ayes, 5 nays, 8 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed with the emergency clause attached.
