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again the position I think of the Appropriations Committee was to retain the reappropriated amount at this point pending further clarification from the federal agencies that are involved in it. Now we understood that the appropriation may, that is, the recommendation may have been contained in the President's budget but again I am not clear on that. But again because of the uncertainty, the committee felt it should remain at this point in the reappropriation bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Would Senator George yield to a couple of questions please?

SENATOR GEORGE: Yes, sir.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Senator George, have you got any kind of written confirmation from Papio that there is no contractual obligation that this money could be called upon for?

SENATOR GEORGE: No, Senator Goodrich, that never (interruption).

SENATOR GOODRICH: You do not, thank you.

SENATOR GEORGE: But there has never been any contractual obligation.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Well, do you have anything in writing from either Papio or any of the Congressional offices that verify that there will not be any federal funding with which this money could be used for match purposes, anything in writing at all?

SENATOR GEORGE: Senator Goodrich, if you read the Omaha World Herald, you will know that all these projects have been cancelled. In addition to that, President Carter will veto any kind of a dam project possible, therefore, right now, this is recreational money. This is not flood money at all. Since we don't build any flood dams we cannot possibly have matching monies for federal projects for recreation around nonexistent dams. Let's just cut it out. It has been there for seven years, use it for something else.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay, thank you, Senator George. You give me a pretty good hint. First of all, you are coming from the World Herald which, well, now naturally we know they are always right but there is another point and that is the fact that you say for recreational purposes and the Papio Resources District does not deal in recreational purposes.
